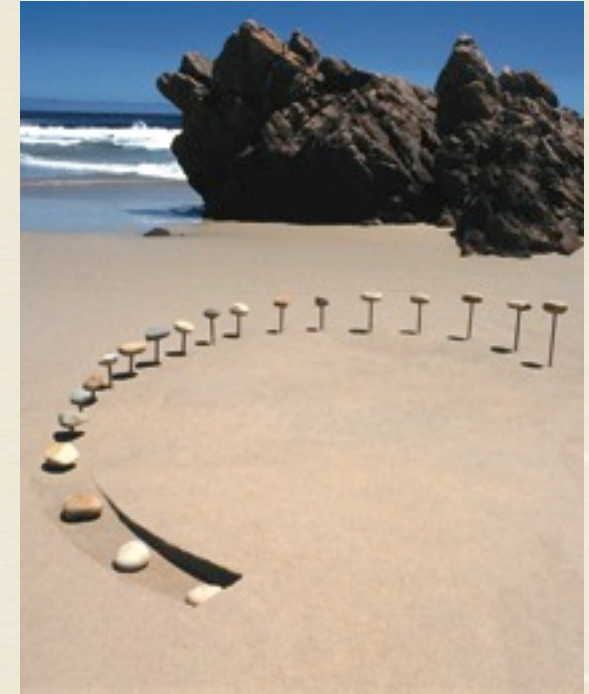

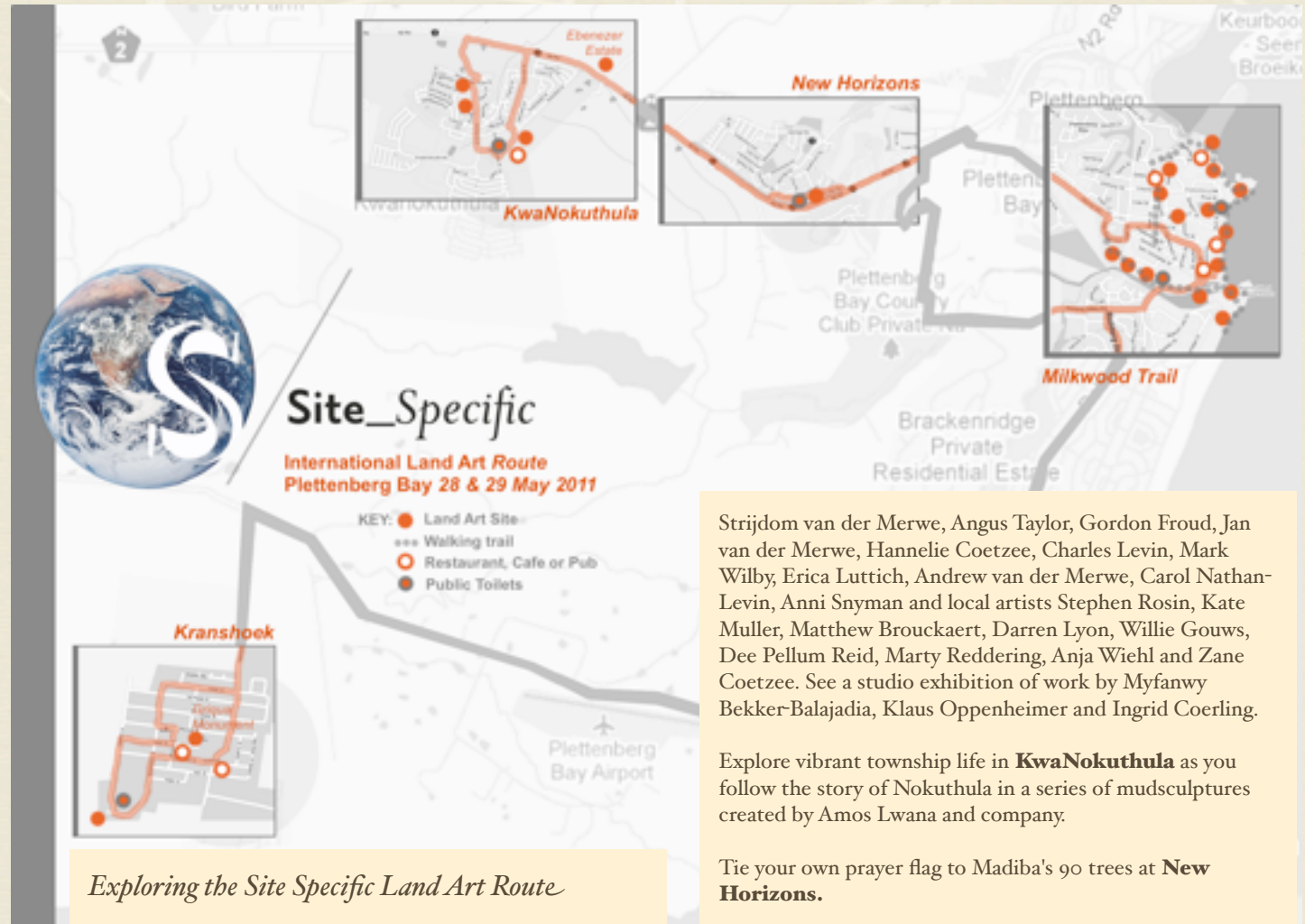
12-16:00 Township Art tours to Kranshoek and KwaNokuthula depart from Central Beach.
